2015 Staff Gathering for Northern Schools

Over fifty teaching staff from Boggabilla, Goodooga, Collarenebri and Mungindi Central Schools met together on Saturday 7 February in Moree, for professional learning and sharing with other colleagues. There was a chance for some socialising at dinner on Friday night where teachers from all schools strengthened their professional relationships.

Mr Mike Tom (Leader, Rural and Distance Education, Bathurst) was the guest speaker at Friday night's social dinner and during the first session of Saturday's school development day. He gave a very interesting presentation on "Rurality" defining it and acknowledging that rural and remote teachers are innovative, determined, and using technology to ameliorate the distance between schools. He also explained how our 4 schools were in a privileged position with seniors having an Access program to help ensure the students have a chance to complete their schooling to the HSC level, and stay within their communities.

Mr Eddie Pitt, one of our special guests, was an inspirational speaker during his Welcome to Country. Everyone was very interested in the recollections he shared of his own school years and how much has changed over the last 50 years.

The staff then collaborated within their Primary and Secondary cohorts to engage with planned agendas. Mrs Nicole Humphries and Mrs Patti Sharwood worked with and lead the Infants and Primary teachers through sessions on literacy and numeracy, enhancing their knowledge to help them continue providing best practise early years' education for K-6 students.

Secondary teachers assisted in presenting sessions to their colleagues about elements of organisational and core business practise for the Northern Border Senior Access Program (NBSA). After lunch teachers networked in subject teams and planned for the beginning of the school year.

We wish to thank the presenters, special guests and staff for making our gathering such a success. Thanks also go to the Albert Motel for accommodating everyone for the night, along with the Moree Services Club who hosted and catered for our event with absolute professionalism
